This e-magazine is a reflection of our journey of service, collaboration, and shared responsibility towards building a sustainable future.





WE RISE BY LIFTING OTHERS







TThe NSS Unit of Loreto College, Kolkata organised a Breast Cancer Awareness Program on March 17, 2025, at Boinchtala Community Hall, targeting women from low and middle-income groups. Conducted by Dr. Prasenjit Chatterjee, Senior Clinical Oncologist, the session focused on symptoms, early detection, self-examination, and risk factors of breast cancer, while also highlighting healthcare schemes like the Swasthya Sathi Card and free screenings at SSKM. Attended by 35 women, the interactive program helped dispel taboos around women's health and underscored the need for expanded outreach through screening camps and awareness drives.

IMPACT

30 women participated in the program, they not only gained knowledge about Cancer, but also learned about the preventive measures for Breast Cancer. Additionally, they were made aware of various health skills.

On 12 April 2025, Loreto College, in collaboration with Ankur Kala NGO, conducted a skill development program for women to promote income generation through small-scale production. A follow-up session was held at Boinchtala on 3 May 2025, after which participants received certificates of training.

To encourage their skills, the NSS Unit of Loreto College organised a sale of handmade paper bags on 14 May 2025, where 67 bags were sold, raising ₹985. The initiative was enthusiastically supported by students and faculty, empowering village women and promoting eco-friendly practices.






APRIL





The Bal Shiksha Sadan teaching program began on 5th April 2025 with B.Ed students of Loreto College. Students engage for 2 hours weekly with children, imparting education, life skills, spoken English, and art & craft. As part of this community engagement initiative, Loreto College also provides books, stationery, and other learning materials.

IMPACT

30 children at Bal Shiksha Sadan are now learning English and have gained the ability to write, opening new doors of opportunity and growth.





On 12th April 2025, Loreto College, in collaboration with Ankur Kala NGO, conducted a one-day skill development training for women to promote income generation through small-scale production. Ankur Kala with their master trainer, provided training to the women for making paper bags of all sizes for daily use.

IMPACT

The initiative empowered women to earn a sustainable income while mastering a new skill. Their dedication paid off with an order of 100 bags, enabling them to generate a substantial amount of revenue."




According to Sustainable Development Goals, Number 5, it covers Gender Equality, ensuring to achievement of gender equality and empowering all women and girls.

Loreto College offers students a unique opportunity to combine academic learning with real-world experience through its structured engagement programs. As part of the Internship Program, dedicate 60 hours to hands-on training, gaining valuable skills that prepare them for future professional endeavors. Complementing this is the Community Outreach Program, where students commit 30 hours to meaningful service activities, fostering social responsibility community awareness. Upon successful completion of the outreach engagement, students awarded certificate contribution recognizing their commitment. This holistic approach not only equips students with practical knowledge but also instills in them a strong sense of civic duty and personal growth.

MAY





In the month of May, Loreto College actively carried out a series of community outreach activities under the UBA (Unnat Bharat Abhiyan) initiative. As part of the registration process, the college adopted **five villages—Sarsuna, Paschim Barisha, Sonamukhi, Shibrampur, and Sakharipota—**located in South 24 Parganas under Asuti II Gram Panchayat of the Thakurpukur Maheshtala Block. Engagements included meetings with the Pradhan and village heads, followed by survey visits to the villages for data collection and need assessment, laying the groundwork for the official UBA registration scheduled for July 2025.



In addition, a sustainability-driven initiative was undertaken through the collection of paper bags from Boinchatala Village, which were then sold on campus, encouraging eco-friendly practices while supporting local communities.

JUNE



On International Yoga Day (June 21, 2025), the NSS Unit of Loreto College, Kolkata, in collaboration with Dibyayan Yoga and Research Centre, conducted a Yoga Workshop at Boinchtala Village. Led by Ms. Kajari Mitra, the session began at 1:30 PM with an introduction, followed by demonstrations of Tadasana, Bhujangasana, Vrikshasana, pranayams like Anulom-Vilom and Kapalbhaati, and relaxation exercises such as Shavasana.

Women and children of the village participated actively, with a special focus on women's health. The event promoted NSS's motto "Not Me But You", fostering cooperation between students and villagers. Trainers guided participants in correct practice, emphasizing Yoga's role in combating lifestyle diseases, stress, and anxiety.

The workshop concluded with a vote of thanks and light refreshments, reinforcing Yoga's importance in enhancing physical health, mental clarity, and emotional balance in daily life.

JUNE

On June 26, 2025, the NSS unit of Loreto College observed International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking with an impactful awareness session. The resource person, Dr. Amarnath Mallik—psychiatrist and guest faculty at the Central Detective Training Institute—was joined by officers from the Shakespeare Sarani Police Station.

Dr. Mallik offered deep insights into the world of drugs, distinguishing between legal and illegal use, while stressing the need for strict regulation of medicinal drugs. Preferring the term "Drug Abuse" over "addiction" to reduce stigma, he unpacked the causes of abuse through the acronym D.R.U.G.S.—Depression, Recreation, Unstable personality, Genetic factors, and Social customs/taboos. He further highlighted a rising concern about this among students, urging young people to seek support, express their feelings, and turn to counselling when needed.

The session left students with greater awareness and a stronger resolve to fight substance abuse—both individually and as a community.



Life Skill Training Program



Loreto College Kolkata conducted a fiveday training program with 47 teachers, counsellors, research scholars, and social workers. The seminar was in collaboration with the Indian Association of Life Skill Education, conducted by A.Radhakrishan and Gavin Hardikar.

IMPACT

The training gave us the idea to reflect on both strengths and weaknesses. It helped in creating self-awareness and helped to understand things better.

The Soroptimist International Calcutta, along with six volunteers from various departments, has been teaching spoken English online since the pandemic. The programme is still ongoing with 11 young ladies in virtual mode.

JULY



On 3rd July 2025, Loreto College celebrated International Plastic Bag Free Day in collaboration with **Hulladeck and Magpet. The highlight** was an insightful talk by Ms. Anisha Pandey, who talked in detail about the many faces of plastics and their types, uses, and impacts. The event also witnessed the inauguration of the Smart Rebin, a step toward practical eco-action. With such initiatives, the college continues to conscious, eco-friendly inspire choices, paving the way for a cleaner, greener tomorrow.

On August 13, 2025, the Department of Education, Loreto College, visited Kalagachia Kailash Kamini High School, Joka, for a Community Outreach Initiative with Bhumi. Around 80-90 students from Classes IX-XII, along with Loreto students, attended a self-defence workshop by Mr. Amrit Bhattacharya, who addressed verbal and sexual abuse, cyberbullying, and adolescent development. The session demonstrated practical defence techniques, raised awareness about abuse, introduced tools like StopNCII.org, and helped boost students' confidence, self-esteem, self-control, and mental and physical health.

It encourages young minds to step forward, engage meaningfully, and dedicate themselves to the service of society. Sergeant Suvankar Chakraborty, OC SOG and Cyber Cell, delivered a presentation on types of cybercrime, preventive safeguards, and steps to take if victimised. The session was interactive, with active student participation.



The PG Department of English, Semester 3, Loreto College, Kolkata, organised a community outreach program on August 30, 2025, at Paschim Barisha village, one of the many adopted by the college. In collaboration with Soroptimist International of Calcutta, the initiative marked International Women's Equality Day, aiming to strengthen ties with the community, spread festive cheer before Durga Puja, and promote health awareness.






Community Out-Reach Program

Students Making a Difference: 30 Hours of Community Service and Growth
