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COLLEGE EVENTS

On July 1, 2024, Loreto College, Kolkata conducted the *Investiture Ceremony* for the Student Council of the Academic Session 2024–2025. The Chief Guest was Mr. Bratya Basu, Honourable Higher Education Minister of West Bengal, who handed over the badges of office to the elected members of the Student Council.



The Anti-Ragging Cell of Loreto College, Kolkata, in collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell, organised an *Anti-Ragging Awareness Session* for all undergraduate Semester II students on August 2, 2024. The session aimed to acquaint the students with the definitions and consequences of ragging as well as the existing redressal mechanisms in the institution.

IQAC EVENTS







DEPARTMENT OF COMPUTER

DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY

DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL SCIENCE

On September 14, 2024, the Department of Political Science organised an online lecture on [India's Climate Policy: Critical Assessment of the Climate Policies in the Present Era](#). The lecture, which was delivered by Mr. Sayantan Bandopadhyay, doctoral scholar at Jawaharlal Nehru University, Delhi, focused on four key areas: the evolution of India's climate policies; a comparative analysis of the climate policies of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh; the impact of climate policies on India's domestic politics; and India's international climate diplomacy strategies.

The speaker was Dr. Priya Singh, Associate Director at Asia in Global Affairs and Postdoctoral Researcher at the Centre on Gender and Forced Displacement, Asian Institute of Technology, Bangkok.

DEPARTMENTS OF ENGLISH, HISTORY, AND POLITICAL SCIENCE

DAG, India's leading arts organisation, conducted a five-day workshop at Loreto College, called [Archive Case Files](#). Held on September 17, 19, 23, 25, and 27, 2024, the workshop was attended by thirty students from the Departments of English, History, and Political Science. The sessions primarily focused on India's involvement in the First World War, utilising a rich collection of postcards depicting Indian soldiers from the DAG archives as a key learning tool. 


DEPARTMENT OF B.ED.

GREEN INITIATIVES

W.E. NATURE SOCIETY

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS) UNIT



SOCIAL SERVICE SOCIETY



Her presentation emphasised the health benefits and moral responsibility of donating blood, dispelled common misconceptions, and alleviated fears surrounding the procedure.



On September 24, 2024 the Social Service Society and the NSS Unit collaboratively hosted a *Blood Donation Camp* with the Association of Voluntary Blood Donors, West Bengal, as the medical partner. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation, with 36 blood donors from among students, faculty members, and staff. A team of 20 volunteers from SSS and NSS played a pivotal role in the seamless coordination of the event, facilitating communication between donors and medical staff and handling logistical aspects.


