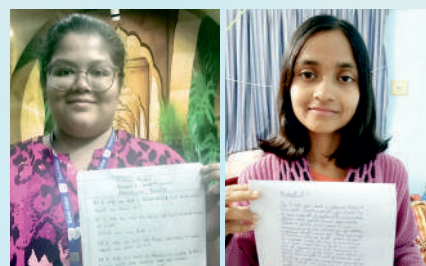


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STUDENTS' WEEK 2025

From January 4–7, 2025, the Literary Society and Poetry Forum of Loreto College, Kolkata, organised a trilingual creative writing competition entitled *In Stanzas and Afterthoughts*. This competition consisted of two categories, namely, Stanzas and Afterthoughts. The former included haikus and tankas, whereas the latter challenged the participants to write thoughtful postscripts responding to one of three prompts. The competition allowed the students to create literary compositions in English, Hindi, and Bengali and broadened their appreciation of linguistic diversity.



On January 5, 2025, the W.E. Nature Society organised a digital poster-making competition on the theme *Our Power, Our Planet*. The theme aligned with the Sustainable Development Goal 12 of ensuring sustainable consumption and production patterns. The vision was to promote awareness regarding renewable resources, emphasising the interconnectedness of human activity as well as ecological balance, and the need to adopt green technologies, conserve biodiversity, and ensure responsible consumption.

Adju-Debate 2025 was the first edition of an inter-departmental debate competition organised by the Debating Society on January 6, 2025. Debating the motion “This house believes that international intervention in domestic conflicts is always wrong,” the participants presented well-researched arguments from both the prosecution and defence sides. The debate concluded with the Department of Political Science emerging as the winner, and a tie between the Departments of Geography and Economics as the runners-up. The judges appreciated and encouraged the debaters for providing their insightful takes on international relations.



STUDENTS' WEEK 2025

As per the guidelines issued by the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal, for organising Students' Week, an Awareness Camp on **West Bengal Student Credit Card Scheme (WBSCCS)** was held on January 7, 2025 at Loreto College. Attended by 216 undergraduate students of Semester I, the session provided information about the loan provisions under WBSCCS. Dr. Debasree Sinha, a Nodal Officer for the scheme, explained the benefits of applying for the student credit card, the eligibility criteria, and the documents required for application. IEC material in the form of the WBSCCS banner was also displayed. The event concluded with the distribution of information leaflets among the students.



A **Health Camp** in collaboration with Allergy & Asthma Treatment Centre (a unit of NCD Immunomedicare Pvt. Ltd.) was organised by the National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit of Loreto College, Kolkata on January 7, 2025. The camp featured an awareness talk on allergy and asthma, which was attended by over 60 students as well as faculty. Free Pulmonary Function Tests (PFTs) were conducted for the students, teaching staff, non-teaching staff, and support staff of the college. Over fifty people underwent PFTs in the camp.



Loreto College, Kolkata organised a **Faculty–Parent/Guardian Interaction** for undergraduate Semester I students from January 7 to 8, 2025. The NEP 2020 places the greatest emphasis on the role of both teachers and parents in providing quality education to students in higher education institutions. Accordingly, the college sought to actively involve parents and guardians in the overall growth and development of their wards. The interaction served as a platform for teachers to share students' progress, including assessments, attendance, and participation in activities beyond the academic sphere, while also learning about their strengths, needs, and learning styles from the parents/guardians.





STUDENTS' WEEK 2025

On January 8, 2025, Ms. Chandrani Sengupta, Head of the Computer Department, conducted an informative session on **Digital Education** for the Semester I B.Ed. students at Loreto College, Kolkata. The teacher trainees gained valuable insight regarding various concepts of digital education, such as mobile learning, simulated learning, MOOCs, and SPOCs. Ms. Sengupta shared valuable information about the management of data using various byte sizes. The talk further explored the future of digital learning and emergent trends, providing a diverse perspective to the teacher trainees regarding the core concepts of digital education.



On January 8, Loreto College organised an awareness talk on **Scholarship Programmes Offered to Students by the Government of West Bengal**. The talk was delivered by Dr. Debika Guha, Associate Professor, Department of Education, with the undergraduate students of Semester III as attendees. Dr. Guha comprehensively explained the various scholarships available to the students in West Bengal, namely SVMCM (Swami Vivekananda Merit-cum-Means Scholarship), Aikyashree, and the Post-Matric Scholarship. The students were also made aware of the help desk available in the college under Ms. Anne Biswas.

COLLEGE EVENTS

On January 9, 2025, the Internal Committee (IC) of Loreto College, Kolkata organised an [Awareness Programme on the POSH Act](#) for 16 members of the support staff.

The resource person was Ms. Neha Pradhan Arora of Mudita Foundation, New Delhi, who elucidated the importance of comprehending the POSH guidelines from the legal and social perspectives, explaining in detail the formal process in place for preventing sexual harassment in the workplace. Her presentation was translated into Bengali by members of the faculty so that the support staff could clearly comprehend the discussion. Ms. Pradhan Arora also interacted with the staff in Hindi and Bengali.



On January 19, 2025, Soroptimist International of Calcutta organised [Winter Warmth](#) at Southern Avenue in collaboration with Loreto College, Kolkata. This event marked the first collaboration between the two institutions following the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU). The event was crafted to offer educational and interactive experiences for children from underprivileged backgrounds. Representatives from Loreto College, comprising eight students from the Departments of English, History, Education, and Political Science, actively participated in the proceedings, orchestrating captivating activities

based on the theme of waste segregation for the 25 participants. The event culminated with the distribution of certificates to the children, recognising their participation in an essay competition and a photography contest.

P&G (Whisper & Gillette India), in collaboration with Right Side Story LLP, organised a workshop titled [Be Your Own Boss \(BYOB\)](#) at Loreto College, Kolkata on January 20 and 22, 2025, for UG Semester I and Semester III students, respectively. The workshops were facilitated by Ms. Disha Ganguly, with assistance from Ms. Baondana Mondal and Ms. Titas Ghosh Chaudhury of Right Side Story LLP. This initiative aimed to create a supportive environment where students could develop self-confidence as well as effective communication and

leadership skills. All attendees were awarded certificates and gifts, while the volunteers received Letters of Recommendation (LORs) for their valuable contributions to the event.



As directed by the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal, an awareness camp about the benefits of the [West Bengal Student Credit Card Scheme \(WBSCCS\)](#) and the convenience

of applying for it at Duare Sarkar Camps was conducted at Loreto College on January 28, 2025. The camp was attended by about 180 students. Eight students were also taken on a visit to the Duare Sarkar Camp of Borough VII, Ward 63, held at 15 Loudon Street, Kolkata 700017. The students were accompanied by the two Nodal Officers and Help Desk for WBSCCS.

A [Fitness Challenge Event](#) was conducted on January 28, 2025 at Loreto College, Kolkata with the objective of promoting physical fitness, teamwork, and healthy competition among students. It was organised by the Park Health Club. There were two main rounds: Planks, where the participants were required to hold a plank position for the maximum duration; and Power Circuit, where the participants had to perform a specific sequence of exercises while timing themselves. The participants exuded remarkable enthusiasm and showcased their physical skills during both the segments. The programme concluded with the organisers announcing the winners of each event and handing over prizes.



On January 30, 2025, Loreto College organised a [Farewell Programme for Dr. Sumita Banerjee](#), Associate Professor and former Head, Department of English, who retired after 32 years of dedicated service to the college. A prayer service was held, followed by a felicitation ceremony and a series of performances by the students. Thereafter, Dr. Banerjee joined the faculty and former teachers for a farewell lunch.

The departmental farewell for Dr. Banerjee was held on February 1, 2025. It featured performances by current students as well as fond reminiscences by past pupils. A magical backdrop of a forest was painstakingly recreated by the students in keeping with Dr. Banerjee's ecological interests. The event concluded with high tea on the lawns of Loreto College.

FOUNDATION DAY 2025

Loreto College, Kolkata marked its Foundation Day (February 2, 1912) with a vibrant celebration on February 4 and 5, 2025 that showcased the institution's commitment to empowering women and fostering a sense of community. The event commenced with a cleanliness drive on February 4 organised by the National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit, with around 54 students joining hands to clean parts of the South Park Street Cemetery.

The celebrations on February 5 began with the lighting of the lamp by several dignitaries, including the chief guest Ms. Susmita Bhattacharya, the local councillor, and Ms. Nandini Bhattacharya, Director, Loreto Higher Education Board. This was followed by a prayer and an opening dance performance. The audience watched a video on the evolution of the college made by students of the Cine Society. Winners of various online competitions conducted for the occasion, including Hackathon, Digital Poster Making, and Creative Writing, were announced. The celebrations also included a sapling planting event.

Sr. Dr. A. Nirmala, Teacher-in-Charge of Loreto College, addressed the gathering, sharing her wisdom and inspiring the students to strive for excellence. Her words were followed by heartfelt testimonials from two young members of the Loreto College Women's Cell, who expressed their gratitude to the institution for supporting them in their educational journey. A lively group dance performance by the young girls of the Women's Cell added a splash of colour and energy to the event.

The second segment featured a thought-provoking panel discussion with four esteemed guests: Dr. Julie Banerjee Mehta (moderator), Sravasti Datta, Chandrani Dutta, and Raka Mukherjee—all former students of Loreto College who shared their insights on the institution's role in fostering gender sensitivity and environmental sustainability. The announcement of the winners of the drawing competition held for the children of Rainbow Homes added a touching moment to the proceedings. The collective singing of the Loreto Chorus brought the memorable programme to a close.



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On February 20, 2025, the faculty of Loreto College, Kolkata had the opportunity to attend a [Session on Integrating Mary Ward's Values into Higher Education](#), delivered by Sr. Sudha. The session served as a reminder of the foundational ethos that continues to shape the mission and vision of Loreto institutions. Sr. Sudha encouraged the faculty to see themselves not only as subject experts but as mentors nurturing human values among students. She also stressed the importance of collaboration, mutual respect, shared purpose, and constructive dialogue among the faculty to foster a sense of community and collectively ensure the flourishing of the institution.



On March 21, 2025, Alliance Française du Bengale organised an [Eastern European Classical Music Masterclass](#) at Loreto College, Kolkata with Dr. Taras Filenko, a Ukrainian pianist and distinguished scholar in the history of music, ethnomusicology, and performance. Dr. Filenko enthusiastically shared the history of different eras of music—the Baroque period from the early 17th century onwards and the period of Classical music from 1750 to the early 1800s. He spoke about composers such as Joseph Haydn, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, and Ludwig van Beethoven. He also played several pieces of music on the college piano, from elegies and emotional pieces to happier and joyous tunes that enlivened and inspired the attendees.



Loreto College, Kolkata organised an [Educational Trip to Bodh Gaya and Rajgir](#) from April 12 to 15, 2025 under the guidance of Sr. Dr. A. Nirmala and Dr. Suparna Bhattacharya. It began with visits to various Bodhi temples in Gaya. The students explored the hills of Rajgir and the lifestyle of rural citizens. They learned about the village of Dasrath Manji, famously known as the “Mountain Man,” who dedicated 22

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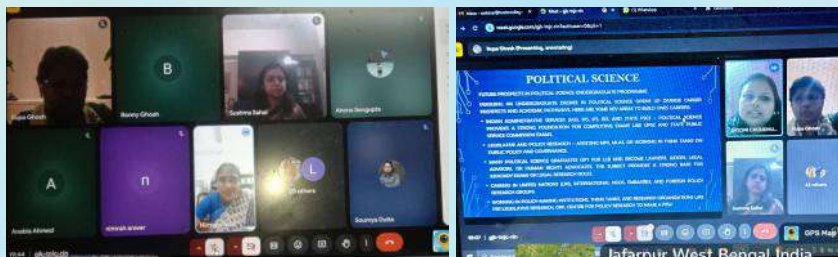
years of his life to creating a road through a mountain using only a hammer, chisel, and knife. Additionally, the students visited the Huang Sung Museum, Nalanda University, the Shakti Peeth of Maa Sati in Gaya, and a Vishnupad temple capturing the history of Gaya. Beneath the Bodhi tree and amidst the quiet ruins of Nalanda, the students found more than lessons in history; they found meaning and connection. They also created a wall magazine on their visit that was inaugurated at Loreto College on May 19, 2025.



An online poster/infographic competition, titled [Ecovision: Towards Sustainability](#), was organised during April 9–22, 2025 for the UG Semester II students of Environmental Studies at Loreto College, Kolkata. The competition celebrated World Water Day (March 22), World Meteorological Day (March 23), and Earth Day (April 22). The three themes for the poster/infographic were: Glacier Preservation (Save Our Glaciers); SDG 13 – Climate Action; and SDG 7 – Affordable and Clean Energy. The competition was judged by the well-known documentary film maker, Ms. Sarmistha Dutta Roy, Faculty, Department of Film Studies, Muralidhar Girls' College. The event was an endeavour to create an environmentally conscious and empathetic student community.



Loreto College, Kolkata organised an online interactive session titled [Exploring Pathways and Opportunities in Higher Education at Loreto College](#) on April 29, 2025 for higher secondary students from various schools in West Bengal and other states across India. The session was designed to guide students in making informed decisions about their higher education journey at Loreto College, with a specific focus on the newly introduced 4-Year Undergraduate Programme under the Curriculum and Credit Framework (CCF) as per the guidelines of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The session witnessed enthusiastic participation from students and teachers representing over 13 schools from various states.



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On May 6, 2025, the Indian Knowledge System Initiatives Committee, in collaboration with the IQAC, organised a [Workshop on Indian Knowledge Systems \(IKS\)](#) to promote awareness of India's rich intellectual traditions and their contemporary relevance. The chief guest, Dr. Tilak Chatterjee, Principal of Bankim Sardar College, emphasised the significance of



integrating IKS into modern education to foster holistic learning. The master trainer on IKS, Dr. Nilendu Chatterjee, Assistant Professor, Department of Economics, Bankim Sardar College, highlighted the contributions of ancient India in fields such as mathematics, astronomy, medicine, linguistics, and environmental science. Participants included faculty members from various colleges and students from various disciplines. The sessions encouraged active discussion, offering participants insights into how ancient Indian knowledge can complement modern scientific approaches.

On May 14, 2025, a [Special Assembly](#) was conducted at Loreto College, Kolkata to honour the memory of those who had lost their lives in the Pahalgam tragedy, while also expressing solidarity with the armed forces of the nation and fellow citizens facing adversity. The programme drew inspiration from the teachings and writings of Lord Buddha and Rabindranath Tagore. Students paid tribute to their philosophies through a song and dance presentation. This was followed by a prayer in memory of the departed souls and a plea for the restoration of peace. A musical ensemble was performed, followed by a respectful rendering of the national anthem.



The Handing Over Ceremony of the Loreto College Student Council (2024–2025) was held on May 24, 2025, with the theme [From Legacy to Leadership: The Flame Lives On](#). The ceremony commenced with the lighting of the lamp by Sr. Dr. A. Nirmala, Chief Guest Dr. Charlotte Simpson-Veigas, and senior faculty member Mrs. Mangala Gauri Chakraborty. A symbolic ceremony followed, during which each

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Student Council member placed a candle around the lamp. Outgoing President Sanjula Shanker handed over the college flag to newly elected President Anuja Prasad, symbolising the transfer of leadership. This was followed by Vice-President Tanushua Goswami passing on her responsibilities to Atreyee



Banerjee, and Treasurer Kamalika Halder to Soumi Pal. The outgoing council heads expressed heartfelt gratitude to the college community in their valedictory speeches. Society heads submitted annual reports, and the outgoing council received certificates and personalised gifts.

On May 24, 2025, a special programme, based on the theme *[Forever Starts Today](#)*, was organised by the Student Council of 2025–26 to bid farewell to the final-year UG and PG students of Loreto College. The event commenced with an inaugural dance presented by Eastern Cultural Society and SPICMACAY. A prayer service by AICUF instilled a sense of spiritual unity in the hearts of the audience. The Teacher-in-Charge, Sr. Dr. A. Nirmala, addressed the departing students with words of wisdom on the importance of reflecting on one's daily actions. The other highlights of the programme were a satirical skit enacted by Dramatics Society and a soulful medley performed by Eastern Cultural Society. The farewell programme came to an end with a cherished unofficial segment.



As part of its commitment to academic innovation and digital integration, the LMS Team of Loreto College, Kolkata arranged for *[Training Sessions on the Learning Management System \(LMS\)](#)* offered by Infotech Lab from June 12 to 14, 2025, catering to both faculty members and students. The orientation, which was conducted by Infotech Lab, aimed to ensure effective adoption and usage of the institutional ERP/LMS platform to enhance teaching, learning, and academic administration. Teachers received hands-on training



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on uploading course materials, managing question banks, evaluating student assessments, and analysing student performance reports. Students were likewise given step-by-step instructions on accessing digital learning resources, submitting assignments, and monitoring academic progress.



The Social Media Committee of Loreto College organised an online [*Workshop on Social Media Techniques*](#) on June 20, 2025. The session aimed to enhance the digital competencies of social media representatives from all the college societies by focusing on key areas such as content creation, digital design principles, content engagement strategies, and performance analysis. Ms. Durba Manigram, an experienced communication professional with over eight years of expertise in advertising, strategic campaigns, brand management, and media planning, conducted the workshop, providing a practical overview of social media strategies and tools to create eye-catching content and maximise audience reach and engagement.

IQAC INITIATIVES

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell organised the first episode of its National-Level Faculty Interaction Series on March 19, 2025. The session, centred on the theme of *Academic Excellence*, was addressed by Dr. Lakshminarayan Satpati, Director, UGC-HRDC, University of Calcutta. Dr. Satpati emphasised the importance of preparing an Institutional Development Plan (IDP) and the need to align with the evolving frameworks of the NEP 2020 and the NAAC criteria. A strong advocate of diversified leadership, Dr. Satpati encouraged the inclusion of resource persons from varied domains such as academia, industry, and independent entrepreneurship. He also stressed the significance of neighbourhood outreach and the need to nurture entrepreneurial independence among learners through innovative internship programmes.

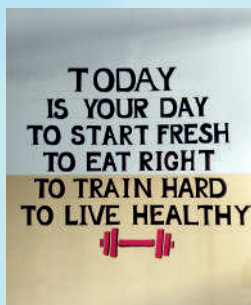

The session focused on *The Binary Accreditation Framework* and was led by Prof. B. Ramya, Associate Director of IQAC at Kristu Jayanti College, Bengaluru. The event provided a platform for faculty members to explore and understand the evolving accreditation landscape in Indian higher education. Prof. Ramya guided the faculty through each criterion of the NAAC framework and addressed many institution-specific queries in detail. The sessions prompted the identification of new angles and alternative approaches to existing institutional practices, especially in the areas of documentation, teaching-learning processes, and qualitative benchmarking.

CAREER COUNSELLING CELL

On February 7, 2025, the Career Counselling Cell of Loreto College, Kolkata, in collaboration with Taksheela Institute of Education (TIE), arranged a special [Session on Study Abroad Programmes](#) for the UG and PG students of English. The session was facilitated by Loreto alumna, Ms. Sristi Mukherjee, who is currently an Overseas Counsellor at TIE. Ms. Sheetal Jalan, the co-founder of TIE; Mr. Suman Bhattacharya, the Director of KIIT Career School; and Dr. Priyadarshi Biswal, the Dean of KIIT Career School, were also present. Dr. Biswal highlighted the need to balance digital competency and profile building alongside the academic curriculum to broaden career opportunities for students of English. Ms. Mukherjee subsequently provided a comprehensive understanding of the PG and PhD application process for studying abroad.

The Career Counselling Cell organised a session on the [Fundamentals of the Common University Entrance Test \(CUET-PG\)](#) on February 20, 2025. The resource person was Ms. Ananya Sarkar, NTA-JRF awardee; doctoral scholar at the Centre for English Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University; and an alumna of Loreto College. Ms. Sarkar shared tips for acing the CUET-PG exam, emphasising confidence, thorough revision, PYQ practice, and YouTube resources. She explained the structure of CUET and offered detailed guidance on the preparation and admission process, addressing various difficulties and solutions. An interactive discussion followed, providing students with an opportunity to pose their doubts and queries.



CELL EVENTS

On March 20, 2025, IMS Learning Services addressed the Semester VI students of Loreto College regarding [MBA as a Career Path after Graduation](#). This event was held under the aegis of the Career Counselling Cell. Mr. Samrat Roy, Chief Mentor at IMS Kolkata, spoke about the prospects of MBA in India, emphasising that admission in premier MBA institutes like IIMs can significantly enhance the chances of securing prestigious jobs. Mr. Roy also highlighted the support provided to MBA aspirants by IMS through systematic study plans, regular mock tests, and assessments. This lecture was followed by numerous queries by the students, who were enthusiastic about pursuing further studies in management training.



The Career Counselling Cell organised an [Interactive Session on How to Face Interviews](#) on March 24, 2025 for the Semester IV students of the B.Ed. Department. Mrs. Reena Sharda, Retired Vice-Principal of South Point School (Primary Section), was the resource person. Ms. Sharda began by sharing an anecdote from her journey in education and her underlying aspirations, prompting the students to reflect on their motivations. Furthermore, she shared insights regarding the curation of an impressive CV and the overall interview process. She urged the students to learn from their setbacks and view rejection as a stepping stone to greater opportunities.



The Career Counselling Cell organised a [Session for Students of Economics](#) on March 24, 2025. Mr. Ajitesh Prasad, Joint Admission Officer at St. Xavier's University, Kolkata (SXUK), commenced the discussion by highlighting the importance of making informed career choices and aligning personal aptitudes with professional aspirations. A presentation by Dr. Sayantan Bandhu Majumder, faculty at SXUK, elaborated on avenues such as data analytics, research associate, and policy research roles at institutions such as NITI Aayog, NCAER, and IEG. An interactive session followed, wherein the resource persons clarified the students' doubts and emphasised the importance of upskilling, continuous career planning, and the relevance of practical competencies.



The Career Counselling Cell organised a [Seminar on UGC-NET Psychology](#) on March 26, 2025 for PG students of Psychology. Ms. Sayani Banerjee offered an insightful discussion revolving around the structure, syllabus, and strategic preparation for the examination. The speaker elaborated on the two-paper

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format and emphasised the importance of understanding key domains such as cognitive psychology, social psychology, research methodology, and psychological testing. Ms. Banerjee also discussed the previous years' cut-offs for the three categories of PhD, NET, and JRF and shared real-life experiences of successful candidates.



On April 7, 2025, Ms. Shreyasi Das Roy, an alumna of the Department of English and currently a student of the B.Ed. Department, conducted an informative [Session on the UGC-NET Examination in English](#). The aim was to provide a clear understanding of the intricacies of the NET exam to the PG Semester I students of the Department of English. Ms. Das Roy explained the eligibility criteria, exam format, and subjects



covered in the test. Additionally, essential books and resources were also recommended for preparation. Ms. Das Roy also discussed the importance of structured study plans and collaboration with peers. This session equipped the students with the necessary tools to navigate the complexities of the NET exam.

On April 24, 2025, the Career Counselling Cell, in collaboration with the Department of Political Science, organised a [Seminar on Career Prospects in Civil Services](#). The speaker was Mr. Vivek Drolia, Director, Department of Telecommunications, Government of India. Mr. Drolia shared his professional expertise while demonstrating a genuine passion for mentoring aspiring civil servants. By recounting his journey into the civil services, he offered students a relatable and humanised perspective of the otherwise rigorous and competitive examination process. The seminar witnessed enthusiastic participation from semester VI students across various departments, underscoring the broad appeal and interdisciplinary relevance of the civil services.



The Career Counselling Cell, in collaboration with Blue Sky Education, presented an *International Education Fair* on May 5, 2025.

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LORETO COLLEGE INCUBATION CENTRE (LCIC)

The LCIC organised an [*Entrepreneurs' Coffee Meet*](#) on January 9, 2025, giving student entrepreneurs an opportunity to reflect on their experience at the Loreto College Open Day and strategise future initiatives. Participants explored innovative ways to enhance awareness within the campus. Skill development emerged as a key focus, along with the need to bolster digital outreach. The meeting concluded on a positive note, with participants emphasising collaboration, innovation, and practical learning as key drivers for future success.



On April 5, 2025, Loreto College, Kolkata hosted the grand finale of [*Innovate for Impact*](#), a national ideation competition collaboratively organised by the LCIC and the IIM Calcutta Innovation Park to



encourage sustainable, socially responsible startup ideas. Out of 40 submissions from across India, eight standout teams were selected to present their innovative business models on campus. The finalists pitched initiatives ranging from cloud kitchens to green technologies and waste management systems, emphasising sustainability through enterprise. The event was graced by Rajya Sabha MP Derek O'Brien, who highlighted that impactful innovation can stem from simple, meaningful ideas. A distinguished panel of judges from academia, industry, and other institutions evaluated the entries. The Heritage College team emerged as winners, with IEM Kolkata and St. Xavier's University Kolkata as runners-up.



UN-MUN CELL

On April 16, 2025, the incipient UN-MUN Cell of Loreto College, Kolkata had its inaugural [*Workshop on Model United Nations*](#), conducted by expert trainers Ms. Simran Koiry and Ms. Anqua Enam. The resource persons outlined key procedures, including committee formation, lobbying, agenda setting, and the importance of research. They shared trusted resources and addressed student queries about representing Global South countries, overcoming blame dynamics, and building alliances. The session also provided invaluable



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guidance regarding the formation of a college MUN team and highlighted how MUNs develop confidence and leadership among students, preparing them for future roles in global diplomacy and public discourse.



On June 27, 2025, representatives of the UN-MUN Cell attended an engaging session at the American Center Library titled [Chat with a Diplomat](#), featuring Mr. Ryan Cleary, a senior U.S. diplomat. Mr. Cleary offered an overview of the structure of the U.S. Government, highlighting key principles such as separation of powers, checks and balances, and federalism. He also explained the functioning of U.S. state governments, drawing comparisons with the Indian system to enhance students' understanding of global governance models. A lively interactive segment followed, where students posed thoughtful questions on topics including U.S. foreign policy and democratic institutions.

PLACEMENT CELL

On January 8, 2025, the Placement Cell, in collaboration with [TCS CSR Youth Employment Programme](#), observed National Youth Day by conducting an extempore competition and orientation for students on contemporary industries and career prospects. The session contrasted government and corporate jobs and lifestyles, highlighted blooming fields such as instructional designing, human resources, and user interface development, and emphasised healthy work-life balance. It was followed by an extempore competition on globalisation and the role of India, and a concluding debate on the nature and implications of AI.



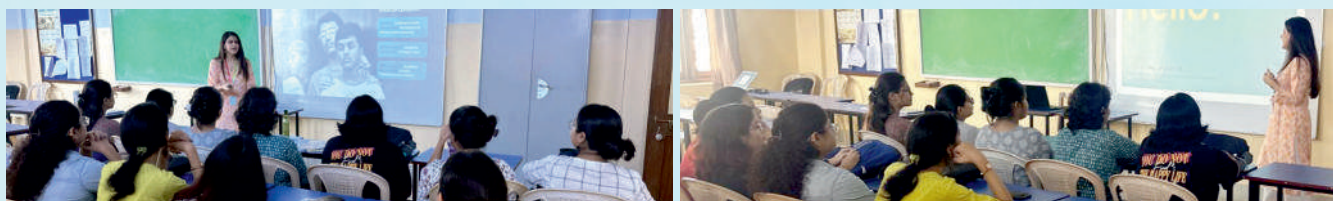

Through a dialogue between self-presentation and psychological perception, she cogently connected personal image with professional and social settings. Highlighting concepts such as visual storytelling, emotional processing, the Image Cycle, colour association, and personal branding, she explored the psychological, cultural, and strategic dimensions of personal styling. The session concluded by encouraging students to embrace authenticity, confidence, and individuality in their sartorial choices.

The Placement Cell, in collaboration with Teach For India, organised a session entitled **Teach For India: Transforming Education for a Brighter Future** on February 28, 2025. Facilitated by Ms. Shivika Seksaria, Senior Manager of Branding, Partnerships & Sourcing, Teach For India, the session was attended by the PG students of English. The primary objective of the session was to introduce the Teach For India Fellowship, a two-year, full-time programme designed to place fellows in schools with the object of driving social change. The resource person also discussed the career-building opportunities available to fellows, the compensation offered, and the application and selection processes in place.



On March 5, 2025, the Placement Cell and the Department of B.Ed., in collaboration with the Public Relations Society of India, organised a workshop on CV Writing titled **Step Up: Turbocharge Your Career and Confidence**. Attended by the final-year B.Ed. students, the session was facilitated by Mr. Soumyajit Mahapatra, Chairman of the Public Relations Society of India, Kolkata Chapter, and Ms. Jharna Bhattacharjee, a model, actress, elocutionist, and lyricist. Alongside a core session on CV writing, they emphasised the significance of presentation, posture, personal styling, social media presence, and platform navigation in shaping a candidate's professional image.



The Placement Cell, in collaboration with Teach For India, organised a workshop on **Unlocking Opportunities in the Social Sector** on March 7, 2025. Catering to the final-year B.Ed. students, the speaker, Ms. Riiei Maia Khogwir, Branding, Partnership, and Sourcing Manager of the Eastern Zone, Teach For India, cogently presented perturbing



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data on the state of learning, the condition of children in education, and the challenges faced by schools. She also demonstrated how Teach For India has been making a tangible difference in bridging key gaps in the education sector and encouraged students to consider the Teach For India Fellowship.

On March 17, 2025, the Placement Cell, in collaboration with Alteus Biogenics Pvt. 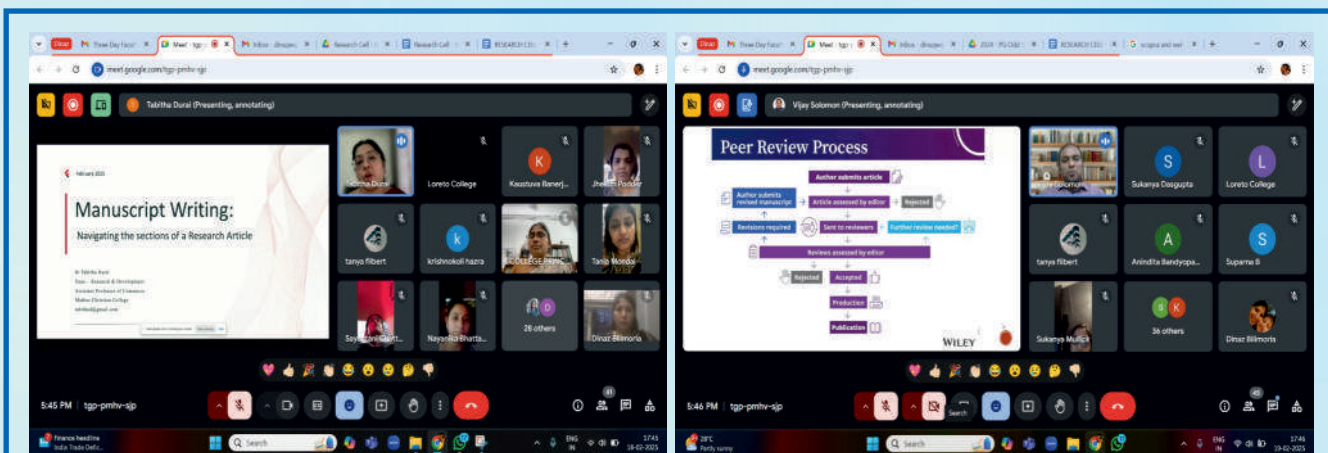

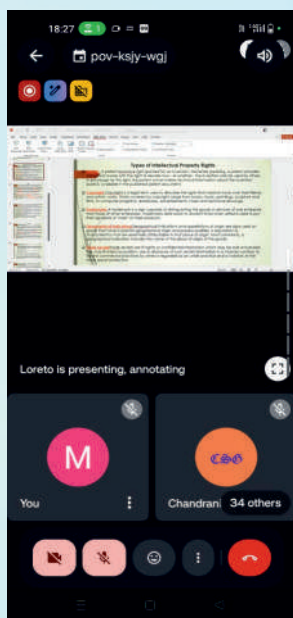
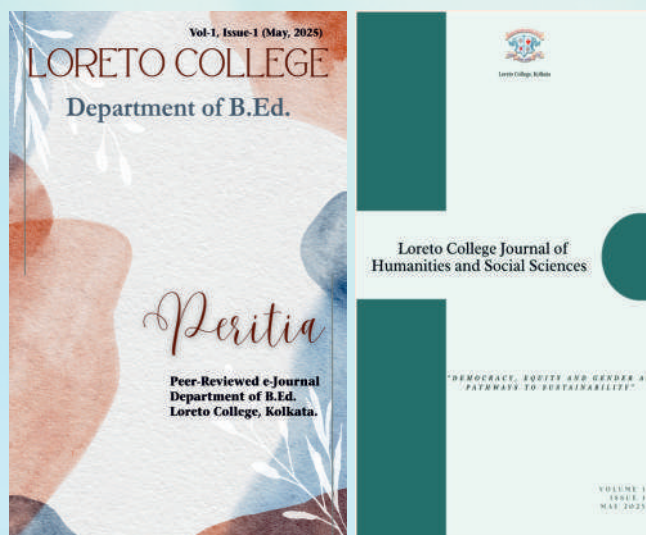

The Research and Development Cell, in collaboration with the IQAC, organised a three-day online Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on [Writing and Publishing for Indexed Journals](#) from February 18–20, 2025. Aimed at strengthening faculty research skills, the FDP featured expert sessions by resource persons from Madras Christian College. On Day 1, Dr. Tabitha Durai focused on effective manuscript writing, emphasising clarity, coherence, and proper structure. Day 2, led by Dr. R. Vijay Solomon, explored publishing challenges, ethical practices, and the identification of predatory journals. On Day 3, Dr. Solomon guided participants through strategies of selecting suitable, high-impact journals for their research. The FDP successfully enhanced the participants’ understanding of academic writing and publishing, equipping them with practical tools and insights.

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On May 28, 2025, the Research and Development Cell held a [Special Online Event](#) to inaugurate the maiden volumes of its two multidisciplinary, peer-reviewed e-journals: *Peritia*, focusing on scholarly investigations pertaining to teacher education, and the Loreto College Journal of Humanities and Social Sciences (LCJHSS), accommodating a wide variety of subjects along the humanities and social sciences spectrum. Launched by Rev. Dr. Fr. Felix Raj, Vice-Chancellor of St. Xavier's University, and attended by contributors, reviewers, faculty, and guests, the event highlighted the journals' projected role in promoting quality research.



The Research and Development Cell, in collaboration with the IQAC, organised an online [Session on Intellectual Property Rights \(IPR\)](#) on June 25, 2025. The speaker was Prof. Sarbajit Sengupta, retired professor from the Department of Economics and Politics, Visva-Bharati University, who delved into the relevance of IPR in academia and research, highlighting practical applications and key considerations for researchers and students. The talk was well-received and enriched the audience's understanding of how IPR intersects with their academic pursuits. The talk was followed by an engaging interactive session, where attendees sought clarifications and gained further insights on various aspects of IPR.

The Wellness Cell, in collaboration with the IQAC and the Food Committee of Loreto College, organised a [Session on Women's Health](#) on March 17, 2025. Dr. Vanita Rahman, clinical instructor in medicine at the George Washington University School of Medicine, internal medicine and

lifestyle medicine physician, certified nutritionist, and personal trainer, delivered an insightful talk on the benefits of plant-based diets. Her discussion covered weight management, acne issues, Polycystic Ovary

Syndrome (PCOS), and breast cancer, along with preventive measures. The session concluded with an interactive segment and a wholesome vegan lunch, reinforcing the importance of healthy dietary choices.



The Wellness Cell and the IQAC organised a [***Workshop on Coping with Stress and Professional Relationships at the Workplace***](#) on June 13, 2025, with eminent psychologist Dr. Anuttama Banerjee as the resource person. The session began with a reflective exercise on personal fears, encouraging the participating faculty members to connect with their emotions. Dr. Banerjee highlighted how reduced personal space increases stress and how many fears stem from basic survival concerns such as failure or rejection. Key strategies discussed included assertiveness, prioritisation, and the “Circle of Control” model, which helps individuals focus on what they can directly influence. The session also introduced the idea of empathy circles to encourage active listening and emotional connection in professional settings.

On June 25, 2025, the Wellness Cell organised two impactful sessions on [***Mental Well-Being***](#) and [***Financial Literacy***](#) for the support staff of Loreto College. The first session on mental well-being was conducted by Ms. Maupali Ghosh, Clinical Psychologist and Counsellor of Loreto College. Participants were introduced to the basics of mental health, managing emotions like frustration, and strategies to handle workplace stress. The session ended with a guided imagery relaxation exercise that left most feeling calm and positive. A session on financial literacy was subsequently led by banking professionals from State Bank of India (SBI), Mr. Ashish Pandey (Trainee Officer) and Mr. Sudip Nath (Branch Manager). They

WOMEN AND GENDER DEVELOPMENT CELL (WGDC)

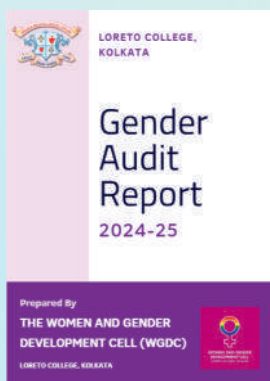

It featured the felicitation of two policewomen from the Shakespeare Sarani Branch, who spoke to students about harassment cases, women's rights, and the importance of self-defence. The female support staff of Loreto College were also felicitated for their tireless contributions. The highlight of the event was the Lakshmi Chatterji Memorial Award, which was conferred upon Ms. Indrani Ghosh for her commendable work focused on promoting the education of economically disadvantaged children and children with disabilities through her institution, Anandan. The final segment was a special lecture on "Women's Voices" by Ms. Sreyashi Ghosh, writer, documentary film maker, and social activist.

CENTRE FOR LIFE SKILLS

The Centre for Life Skills, Loreto College, Kolkata, in collaboration with Scottish Church College, conducted a **Future Fit: Employability Skills** programme on February 21, 2025 for UG Semester VI students. The first half of the session was conducted by Dr. Suparna Bhattacharya and Ms. Nayanika Saha. Through a series of activities and games, students were trained in effective communication, self-awareness, teamwork, collaboration, mindfulness, problem solving, planning, strategy, and organisational skills. The second half was conducted by Mr. Pinaki Mondal, Assistant Professor, Department of Business Administration, Scottish Church College, who provided a detailed outline of soft skills for future career opportunities.



On March 26, 2025, an interactive session on **Future Fit: Facilitation Skills** was conducted for Semester VI students as part of a skill development initiative. The first half, led by Dr. Satyabrota Kundu, Dr. Mainak Bhattacharjee, and Ms. Tania Mondal, featured two experiential activities—The Zoo Challenge and The Fishbone Challenge—enhancing non-verbal communication, teamwork, critical thinking, and problem solving. 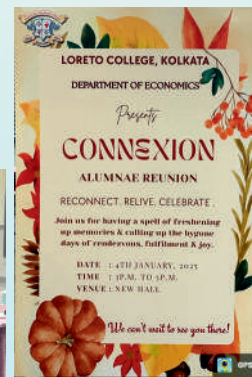

DEPARTMENT OF BENGALI

On January 16, 2025, the Department of Bengali, in collaboration with the IQAC, organised [Ghare Baire](#), a heritage tour. Eight students participated in the tour, which was led by Dr. Amrita Dasgupta. The students visited three major heritage sites in the city: Raja Ram Mohan Roy's house, Rabindranath Tagore's house in Jorasanko, and Swami Vivekananda's residence. They explored various artefacts, architectural features, manuscripts, and gallery displays at all three locations. The visit offered immersive historical and cultural experiences and deepened the students' appreciation for their nation's pioneers.



DEPARTMENT OF COMPUTER

On February 27, 2025, the Computer Department organised a hands-on session on [Data Science & Generative AI](#) with Praxis Tech School for UG and B.Ed. students. The session was led by Dr. Sourav Saha, Director of Data Science & Dean Academics at Praxis, and his team, who explained the real-life applications of AI and its role in transforming industries. Students learned about machine learning models, neural networks, and their impact on decision-making processes. A practical segment also allowed them to work with AI-based software such as Claude AI, with a special emphasis on prompt engineering, data analysis, and content creation. The session ended with an interactive discussion where students asked about AI careers and ethics.



DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

On March 6, 2025, an [Industrial Visit to Diamond Beverages Private Limited \(DBPL\)](#), one of the leading bottling partners of the Coca-Cola Company in India, was organised by the Department of Economics. The visit offered 17 students of Semester VI an opportunity for experiential learning and building up a strong industry-academia

synergy in teaching-learning. The students were briefed on Coca-Cola's history, operations, market strategies, and supply chain management and taken on a guided tour of the production facility. They witnessed the different stages of beverage manufacturing first hand and gained a comprehensive understanding of the industrial workflow and production processes.

The Department of Economics organised its annual quiz competition, *Ignition*, on May 8, 2025. Three teams representing Semesters II, IV, and VI participated in the competition, which was based on the theme of Intellectual Property Rights (IPR). The quiz was conducted in two rounds: the first focusing on general knowledge related to IPR and the second being a fact-checking segment on India and IPR. Both rounds were curated by faculty members Mr. Nilavo Roy and Mr. Mainak Bhattacharjee, who also served as quizmasters. The Semester IV Team, represented by Vanshika Agarwal and Arushi Bajpai, emerged as the winners of Ignition 2025.



DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

On January 7, 2025, Semester I and Semester III students of the Department of Education, along with the faculty members, embarked on an enriching *Educational Tour to the Ramkrishna Mission Swami Vivekananda Ancestral Home and Cultural Centre*. The trip was an attempt to immerse the students in the life, teachings, and legacy of one of India's greatest spiritual leaders and educators. It was not only an exploration of Swami Vivekananda's early life and the history of his family but also an opportunity to experience the powerful impact of his philosophy. The museum's exhibits were carefully curated, and through movies, art, music, and storytelling, the students were able to appreciate Swamiji's transformative journey.



On March 26, 2025, the Department of Education, in collaboration with the IQAC and MENTAID Kolkata, celebrated *World Down Syndrome Day (March 21) and World Autism Day (April 2)*. The event showcased a programme centred on the theme of inclusion, with students and teachers from MENTAID and Loreto College participating. The programme began with a prayer service and a dance performance by

students from both MENTAID and Loreto College. The Loreto College students paid tribute to the MENTAID participants with a medley of songs, a presentation highlighting the achievements of individuals with Down Syndrome and Autism, and a recitation. Ankit from MENTAID captivated the audience with his poetry.



DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

On January 3, 2025, the Department of English organised the **Launch of Zilka Joseph's Book** *Sweet Malida: Memories of a Bene Israel Woman*. Conducted in a hybrid mode, the event was attended by the UG and PG students of the college, faculty of the Department of English, family members and friends of the author, as well as retired professors of the college and guests. Sr. Dr. A. Nirmala, Teacher-in-Charge of Loreto College, along with Ms. Zilka Joseph and Dr. Julie Banerjee Mehta, released Ms. Joseph's book, after which the author engaged in conversation with Dr. Mehta and navigated the poetics of the newly unveiled publication.



On January 31, 2025, the Department of English organised a **Special Session on Paul Celan**, one of the most significant voices in post-war literature. Attended by the UG and PG students and the faculty of the department, the lecture was delivered by Mr. Bertrand Badiou, director of the Paul Celan Research Unit at the École Normale Supérieure, Paris, and the custodian of the poet's literary estate alongside Eric Celan. Although the lecture was delivered in French, Mr. Badiou's animated delivery and the swift translations by the interpreter from Alliance Française du Bengale kept the non-French speakers engrossed. The talk was followed by a short interactive session, and the programme concluded with five UG and PG students reading out five of Celan's poems.

The Semester VI students of the Department of English went on an [**Educational Field Trip to the Natya Shodh Sansthan Archives and Museum**](#) at Salt Lake in two groups on February 11 and 18, 2025. They participated in a guided tour led by an enthusiastic curator from the museum, which provided valuable insights into the techniques and historical contexts of various Indian theatrical forms. The students experienced a thorough journey through the evolution and variety of theatres, including classical Sanskrit theatre, folk theatre, and post-Independence theatre. The visits imparted a deep and immersive understanding of plays, performance, and dramaturgy.



On February 27, 2025, four UG students from the Department of English attended a [**Writing Workshop on Great Americans: Martin Luther King Jr.**](#) organised by the American Center, Kolkata. Dr. Mukulika Dattagupta, Fulbright-Nehru alumna and Associate Professor of English at Adamas University, led the session. After a succinct introduction of Martin Luther King Jr. and his ideologies, Dr. Dattagupta delved into the notion of writing and speech as tools of expression and change. The participants studied King's speeches, articulated their observations, and engaged in a writing exercise that helped them understand King and his art of rhetoric better.



On April 16, 2025, the final-year students of the UG and PG batches of the Department of English participated in an intensive [**Workshop on Personal Essays and Narratives**](#) conducted by Dr. Liesl



Schwabe, a Fulbright-Nehru Scholar (2024–25) and coordinator of writing across the curriculum, Berkshire Community College, U.S.A. Dr. Schwabe explained what personal writing entailed, with special emphasis on the 'I' persona, the context in which the author is writing, and the persona's actions and significance as reflected in the narrative. The students also had first-hand experience in penning personal essays based on assigned prompts.

On May 5, 2025, the UG and PG students of the Department of English experienced a memorable [**Lecture and Demonstration on Putul Nach**](#), conducted by Dr. Sudip Gupta and Dr. Sriparna Gupta of the Dolls Theatre, Kolkata. The lecture commenced with an introduction to the various forms of puppetry, with each

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explanation being accompanied by live demonstrations. Dr. Sudip Gupta also screened short performances of putul nach scripted and directed by the Dolls Theatre. The highlight of the session was when the students were encouraged to 'try their hands' at puppetry. The session terminated with Dr. Sriparna Gupta emphasising the need to preserve the tradition of putul nach.



On May 12, 2025, the Semester VI students of the Department of English embarked on a [*Colonial City Tour*](#), visiting the Manicktala Jain Temple complex, St. John's Church, and Eden Gardens to gain an appreciation of the vibrant history and cultural tapestry of the city of Kolkata. From exploring the contribution of the diasporic Jain community to critically viewing the iconic Black Hole Tragedy memorial site and Job Charnock's mausoleum, and exploring Sir Auckland's Gardens where the colonial rulers would promenade, the students gained a deeper understanding of the diverse cultural influences that have shaped a colonial city like Kolkata.



Anosuya Bhattacharya, student of Semester III, Department of English, passed away tragically on December 30, 2024. The department organised a memorial service in her honour on February 24, 2025. Her mother also donated books to the Central Library in her memory, leading to the inauguration of the *Anosuya Bhattacharya Memorial Collection* on May 5, 2025.

DEPARTMENT OF FILM STUDIES

On January 14, 2025, the Department of Film Studies organised a workshop on filmmaking for the IDC and Minor students of Film Studies. Entitled ***From Script to Screen: Developing Ideas into Visual Mode***, the workshop was conducted by Mrs. Sarmistha Dutta Roy and delved into various aspects of the craft, including editing, budgeting, and the documentary style of filmmaking. One of the most enriching parts of the workshop was the practical session where Mrs. Roy guided a few volunteers through the process of shooting short clips and maintaining continuity. She also screened her award-winning documentary on street fashion in Kolkata.



The Department of Film Studies organised an interactive session for Semester II IDC and Minor students of the department April 2, 2025. The session dealt with ***The Art of Copywriting and the Role of Storytelling in Branding, Advertising, and Social Media***. It was conducted by Ms. Joyeeta Majumdar, an experienced professional and alumna of the college, who shared her experience working in diverse creative roles ranging from copywriting and social media promotion to writing for the screen. She also offered insights into the ways in which a college student could engage in relevant networking and internships.



DEPARTMENT OF GEOGRAPHY

To commemorate World Meteorological Day (theme: Closing the Early Warning Gap Together) on March 23, 2025, the Department of Geography, Loreto College, in collaboration with the Department of Geography, Nirmala College, Ranchi, organised a ***National Inter-College Poster and Photography Competition***. Dr. Aritra Khettry, National Lead for Elephant Conservation at WWF India; and Mr. Sanjay Bose, renowned photographer and faculty member of Mass Communication at Ranchi University, evaluated the entries. In the Digital Poster category, Tanisha Purakayastha (Semester IV) and Uditi Mahapatra (Semester VI) were placed first and second respectively, while Rose Minj (Semester VI) and Fariha Firdous (Nirmala College, Ranchi)

jointly shared the third position. In Photography, the first, second, and third positions were secured by students of Nirmala College, Ranchi, viz. Jyoti Kumari, Sristy Lomga, and Sulekha Singh Munda respectively.

The Department of Geography organised a [**Study Tour: Experiential Learning at the Solar Dome Museum**](#) on April 29, 2025. Seventy-five students and four faculty members visited India's first Solar Dome Museum in Kolkata. During the tour, students explored interactive exhibits, installations, and simulations on the greenhouse effect, climate change, energy conservation, and carbon footprint reduction strategies. The visit deepened students' understanding of sustainable energy practices and solar technology.



DEPARTMENT OF HINDI

The Department of Hindi, in collaboration with the IQAC, organised a [**Special Lecture for World Hindi Day**](#) on January 10, 2025. The lecture, which was delivered by Prof. Kiran Singh, was focused on the great Hindi poet Nagarjuna and his role in making Hindi a global language. Prof. Singh discussed Nagarjuna's role in making Hindi literature a literature of the revolutionary masses and popularising it among non-Hindi readers as well. She presented various examples from Nagarjuna's poetry and taught students the art of understanding poetry while appreciating the richness and simplicity of the Hindi used.



DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY



The Department of History, in collaboration with the History Society, organised a programme to mark [**Holocaust Remembrance Day**](#) on January 27, 2025 in an effort to pay homage to the victims and survivors of the inhumane atrocities committed during the Holocaust. The programme

featured a presentation by the Semester III students of the department, with eight students dissecting various aspects of the Holocaust and highlighting the significance of the event in world history. The faculty members of the department also shared their opinions and suggestions at the end of the event.

On February 28, 2025, the Department of History, in collaboration with the History Society, organised a [Workshop on Reading Family Photographs](#). Prof. Geraldine Forbes, an educator as well as an eminent scholar of Gender Studies, conducted the workshop, the aim of which was to explore the history of a family by analysing family photographs. The students participated actively and discussed specific family histories and relevant contexts with Dr. Forbes and the faculty members. The workshop proved to be a valuable learning experience that offered the students fresh perspectives on historical understanding and research.



The Department of History inaugurated its Alumnae Lecture Series I with a session titled [History and Historiography](#) on March 28, 2025. Semester II History Major students had the unique opportunity of interacting with two extremely talented alumnae, Ms. Ahana Sen and Ms. Sudeshna Sarkar, who are PG students at the Department of History, Jadavpur University. The session provided a lucid explanation of what historiography is, its importance, the various schools of historiography for Indian history, as well as practical advice on reference work and preparations for examinations.



On April 8, 2025, the Department of History conducted a [Field Trip Based on Student Initiative](#) for Semester VI students. The students were divided into six groups with their respective leaders. Each group decided upon a place to visit in Kolkata, with the purpose of understanding heritage and historical significance, along with inculcating self-planning skills. Belgachia Rajbari, Marble Palace, St. John's



Church, Netaji Bhawan, and Indian Museum were the places selected for this experiential learning exercise.

On April 8, 2025 the Semester II Major students of the Department of History went for an [Educational Trip to the Asiatic Society](#), which is one of the oldest and most revered institutions for academic learning in India. The trip was intended to familiarise students with primary sources, rare manuscripts, artefacts, and conservation methods in historical research. The tour began in the central hall, with an introductory discussion, and covered the Library, the Museum, and the Conservation Laboratory.

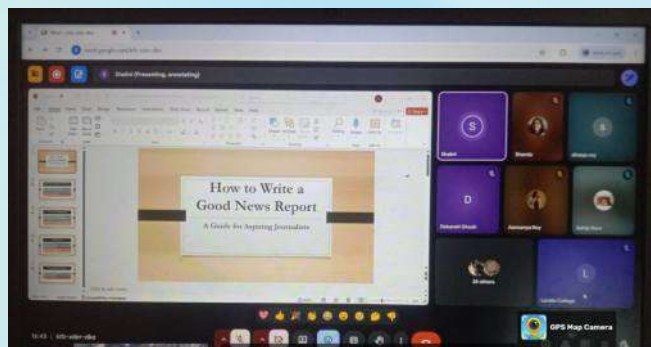


On June 28, 2025, the Department of History organised an enriching [Academic Visit to the Alipore Museum](#), where an evocative exhibition of coloured etchings by François Baltazard Solvyns was on display. Solvyns, a Flemish artist who arrived in Calcutta in the late 1700s, produced an encyclopaedic pictorial record of Bengal's people in his monumental four-volume series titled *Les Hindous* (The Hindus). Students actively engaged with the museum's apprentices, who provided critical insights into the significance of each artwork. The exhibition also facilitated an interactive session with Ms. Ayana Bhattacharya, a representative from DAG (Delhi Art Gallery).



DEPARTMENT OF JOURNALISM AND MASS COMMUNICATION

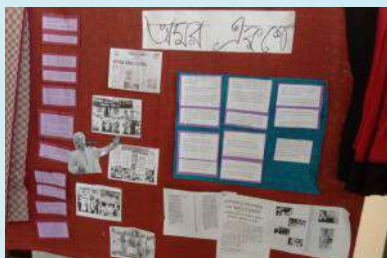
On June 28, 2025, the Department of Journalism and Mass Communication hosted an online [Workshop on Report Writing](#) for all the report writers of the societies, cells, and the B.Ed. Department. The resource person was Ms. Shalini Datta, a seasoned specialist in social media and multimedia communications. With over 7-8 years of professional experience in the media industry, Ms. Datta shared valuable insights into effective and ethical reporting. Her detailed critique of student-written reports, combined with practical tips, made the session highly interactive and impactful. Her emphasis on credibility, journalistic ethics, and clarity provided students with a clear framework for crafting effective reports.

DEPARTMENT OF LIBRARY

The Library Department, in collaboration with the IQAC, organised a special event on February 21, 2025 to commemorate **International Mother Language Day**. The programme highlighted linguistic diversity and the importance of mother tongues, with a special focus on the rich linguistic and cultural heritage of Northeast India. The chief guest was Mr. Ramkumar Mukhopadhyay, former Regional Secretary of the Sahitya Akademi and a noted author. He discussed the reasons behind language extinction and highlighted three languages from Northeast India that have managed to revive themselves despite the threat of disappearance. Renowned Mizoram-based writer Malsawmi Jacob joined the programme virtually to speak about the languages, scripts, and literatures of various states in Northeast India. A student panel featuring five participants from Assam, Sylhet, Nagaland, Mizoram, and Manipur shared insights into the history, diversity, and folklore of their regional languages. The event also featured captivating performances of Bengali music, a historical presentation on the language movement, and an exhibition.



DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL SCIENCE

On January 16, 2024, in observance of National Human Trafficking Prevention Month, the U.S. Consulate General in Kolkata organised the **Freedom Network Workshop** to raise awareness about human trafficking. The event honoured individuals and organisations combating this transnational crime and featured sessions with experts from law enforcement, legal, and social services. It was attended by Loreto College students of Political Science and Human Rights. The workshop emphasised the need for collective action, education, and strong anti-trafficking measures to combat this grave human rights violation.



The Department of Political Science, in collaboration with the IQAC, the Political Science Society, and the National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit, organised an inter-college essay-writing competition to commemorate **National Voters' Day** on January 25, 2025. The competition was conducted in an online mode between January 25 and January 31. The topic—"One Nation, One Election: Can it Work for India?"—aimed to stimulate critical analysis on the feasibility of simultaneous elections in the country. Munazzah Shamim (Third Year, Loreto College) secured the first position, while Akshiti Prasad

(Third Year, Loreto College) and Tanzila Khan (First Year, Jyoti Nivas College) secured the second and third positions respectively.

On February 7, 2025, Semester III and Semester VI students from the Department of Political Science participated in an event hosted at Scottish Church College, Kolkata. Titled [Eastern South Asia Today: Issues of Diplomacy and Peace](#), the seminar was jointly organised by the Peace Studies Cell in collaboration with the Departments of History, Philosophy, and Political Science. This interdisciplinary gathering attracted students from numerous colleges across the city. The seminar focused on unravelling the intricate factors disrupting peace in the Eastern South Asian region, encompassing Bangladesh, Bhutan, Nepal, and the eastern and north-eastern states of India.



On March 13, 2025, the Department of Political Science organised a [Field Trip to the Alipore Jail Museum](#) for the Semester VI students. The primary objective of this visit was to analyse the historical and political significance of the site, particularly in the context of the Indian freedom struggle. The class was divided into eight groups, with each group assigned to study a specific section of the museum in detail. Groups 1 and 2 examined the Watchtower; Groups 3 and 4 explored the Netaji Exhibition Room; Groups 5 and 6 analysed the Cells and Gallows; and Groups 7 and 8 studied the Police Museum. This immersive experience allowed students to critically reflect on the struggles of the past.



The Department of Political Science conducted a seminar in collaboration with T.I.M.E. titled [MBA: Path to be CEO](#) on March 26, 2025. The objective of this session was to furnish students with comprehensive insights into the MBA journey, encompassing admission procedures, entrance examinations, and career prospects. The keynote speaker, Mr. Kaustav Kundu, offered detailed elucidations on prominent business schools in India, outlining their admission criteria and selection protocols and emphasising preparatory strategies. The seminar attracted an audience of over 100 students from diverse academic disciplines.

On April 4, 2025, the Department of Political Science, in collaboration with the Political Science Society, organised [Dialego 2025](#), its annual students' meet and flagship event. This year, the event was elevated to an international conference format with the central theme "From Margins to the Center: Gender, Environment, and Political Change." The keynote address by Dr. Pratip Chattopadhyay, Associate Professor, Department of Political Science, Kalyani University set the tone for the day, weaving together

the thematic threads of gender, environmental justice, and political transformation. A stimulating panel discussion followed, led by Dr. Sulagna Maitra, Associate Professor, University College Dublin, with Dr. Sujata Chowdhury as the discussant. One of the highlights of Dialego 2025 was its parallel paper presentation sessions, involving UG and PG students from leading institutions across the city. These sessions offered a platform for students to present original research and policy ideas, promoting peer learning and academic exchange. The Hackathon, conducted as an off-stage event, saw teams develop and present innovative policy briefs and solutions addressing pressing socio-political challenges. An intense inter-college debate on the motion: “This House Believes that Developed Nations Should Bear a Greater Responsibility for Addressing Climate Change” was also conducted, with Scottish Church College emerging as the winning team.



The Department of Political Science, in collaboration with the Political Science Society, organised its annual alumnae interaction session titled [*Roots and Wings: Stories from our Alumna*](#) on May 10, 2025. The online session witnessed enthusiastic participation from over 98 attendees, including students and faculty members. The event featured Ms. Sanra Shaw, alumna of the department and currently the Chief Operating Officer of Women Weave Charitable Trust and the REHWA Society, as the distinguished speaker. Her address provided valuable insights into India's developmental sector, with a specific focus on the preservation and promotion of traditional weaving arts and the empowerment of women artisans.



DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY

A [*Workshop on Mental Health in Everyday Worklife*](#) was organised by the Department of Psychology and the College Counsellor on January 16, 2025 for 13 support staff of Loreto College. Sr. Dr. A. Nirmala, Teacher-in-Charge; Ms. Prajna Dutta, College Counsellor; and Dr. Jhelum Podder of the Department of Psychology were present at the workshop. Its purpose was to initiate mental health awareness among the

The students of Semester I of the Department of B.Ed. had the opportunity to attend the [CIS Symposium 2.0](#) on February 1, 2025 at Calcutta International School. This experiential learning platform featuring a panel discussion and a workshop enabled the students to interact with renowned educators and industrialists, enhancing their knowledge and communication skills.

On February 28, 2025, the Department of B.Ed. hosted a [Workshop on Joyful Teaching and Learning](#), led by alumna Ms. Sonali Lahiri. The session featured creative, hands-on activities such as dramatisation, communication games, and storytelling, encouraging students to explore play-based learning. Engaging tasks such as the garland challenge and the "Feely Bag" exercise emphasised creativity, teamwork, and communication. Rooted in NEP 2020 ideals, the workshop highlighted the importance of joyful, child-centric teaching. Students left inspired and better equipped to make learning engaging and meaningful.



On March 4, 2025, the Department of B.Ed. hosted an enriching session on the [Ignatian Pedagogical Paradigm \(IPP\) and Transformative Education](#) for final-semester students. Conducted by Prof. (Dr.) Charlotte Simpson Veigas, faculty at St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata and a Loreto alumna, the session explored IPP's five elements—context, experience, reflection, action, and evaluation. Dr. Veigas illustrated its real-life applications through videos and interactive discussions, emphasising education's transformative role in nurturing empathy, critical thinking, and growth.

DEPARTMENT EVENTS

On March 21–22, 2025, the fourth-semester B.Ed. students of Loreto College embarked on a [**Field Trip to Santiniketan**](#) for an experiential learning trip, accompanied by Dr. Kaustuva Banerjee and Dr. Suparna Ghosh. They explored the University Museum, Surul Rajbari, and Sonajhuri Haat, which deepened their understanding of Tagore’s educational philosophy. Engaging with local artisans, Baul singers, and residents, students experienced the integration of nature, creativity, and learning. The visit highlighted the value of education beyond textbooks, rooted in experience and cultural heritage. The trip fostered reflection on Tagore’s ideals, reinforcing that true teaching inspires connection, creativity, and a lifelong love for learning.



On March 26, 2025, the Department of B.Ed. held a [**Workshop on Pre-Primary and Primary Teacher Training**](#) for Semester IV students. Conducted by Ms. Meeta Chatterjee and Ms. Renu Bagrodia, the sessions emphasised music, movement, and art as powerful teaching tools. Ms. Chatterjee highlighted music’s role in cognitive development and speech improvement, while Ms. Bagrodia demonstrated creative art techniques to enhance learning across subjects. Interactive activities, such as storytelling, rhymes, and art-making, engaged students deeply. The workshop provided practical strategies to make learning joyful and meaningful, leaving trainee teachers inspired and better prepared to teach young learners effectively.



On April 2, 2025, Semester II students of the Department of B.Ed. attended a [**Workshop on First Aid and Basic Life Support**](#), organised in collaboration with the Institute of Preventive Awareness and the IQAC. The session covered emergency response techniques, including bleeding control, fracture management, burn response, and recovery positions. Blood donation guidelines and the “Stop, Drop, and Roll” technique for burns were emphasised. Practical demonstrations, focus-building methods, and a guided meditation enriched the session. The workshop proved highly informative, equipping teacher trainees with vital life-saving skills and confidence to respond effectively in emergencies.

DEPARTMENT EVENTS

A [Series of Field Visits](#) were organised by the Department of B.Ed. between April 21 and May 7, 2025.

- On April 21, students visited the Indian Institute of Cerebral Palsy (IICP) in Taratala, Kolkata, which offered valuable insight into the functioning of a well-structured, holistic support system for individuals with complex needs.
- On April 22, the History Method students visited the Marble Palace, a historical site rich in colonial-era art and architecture. This immersive experience enhanced their academic knowledge and appreciation for heritage preservation.
- On the same day, Geography method students visited the Agri-Horticultural Society of India. The trip encouraged them to take an interest in environmental conservation and gardening.
- On April 27, History method students visited Hamsheswari Temple, Bandel Church, Hooghly Imambara, Chandannagar College, and the French Museum. The tour offered valuable historical insights and broadened their understanding of Bengal's cultural diversity.
- On April 29, a visit to the Oral School for the Deaf raised awareness about challenges faced by hearing-impaired children and the essential role that speech therapy and specialised teaching play in their development.
- On April 30, students visited Akshar School, a model for inclusive education. The experience highlighted the need for safe, accepting environments and the role of proper training and infrastructure in inclusive education.
- On May 7, Economics method students visited the Dakshinapan Shopping Complex as part of a commercial exploration. The visit demonstrated how cultural heritage supports local economies and fostered appreciation for India's artisanal richness.



DEPARTMENT EVENTS

A [CV Writing Competition](#) was organised for the Semester IV students of the Department of B.Ed. on March 30, 2025, with the objective of enhancing students' professional development and preparing students for job and internship opportunities. Ms. Ceiloni Sengupta, Assistant Teacher (TGT), Indus Valley World School evaluated the CVs and suggested recommendations for further improvement. The result was declared on April 30 and Shreeja Chatterjee, Bhavika Subnani, and Saheli Kabi secured the highest position.

On May 7, 2025, Semester II students of the Department of B.Ed. attended the first session of its Alumni Lecture Series, entitled [Beyond Chalk and Talk: An Exploration of Engaging Teaching-Learning Strategies](#). Conducted by Ms. Shreyoshi Dutta, an alumna of the department and Senior Secondary English Faculty at Vibgyor High, Bangalore, the session introduced interactive and student-centred teaching methods. Through digital tools such as Edpuzzle, Google Maps, and the Spinner Tool, and strategies such as flipped classrooms and project-based learning, Ms. Dutta emphasised creativity, inclusion, and engagement. The session empowered the teacher trainees to move beyond traditional methods and create dynamic, curiosity-driven learning environments.



On May 30, 2025, the Semester II students of the Department of B.Ed. organised a heartfelt [Farewell Programme](#) for the outgoing Batch of 2023–2025. The event featured a prayer service, a lively medley, a touching video of the Santiniketan visit, and a powerful dance drama titled Anusmriti, highlighting women's struggles and resilience. Club leaders shared their reflections, and a digital calendar showcased various departmental activities. Semester IV students delivered vibrant performances, and a nostalgic presentation captured memorable moments. Speeches by Sr. Dr. A. Nirmala and Dr. Kaustuva Banerjee brought the evening to a close, followed by the distribution of tokens of love.



On June 13, 2025, the Department of B.Ed. organised an [Online Session on Basic Financial Literacy](#) for Semester II and IV students. The session was conducted by Mr. Soumyajit Banerjee, Senior Product Manager at Thomson Reuters. Aimed at equipping future educators with essential financial knowledge, the session covered the importance of saving, investing, budgeting, and financial planning. Mr. Banerjee also introduced various investment tools and discussed the value of life insurance. He encouraged the students to take control of their financial futures through informed decisions.

DEPARTMENT EVENTS

COLLABORATIVE EVENTS

On March 19, 2025, the Departments of B.Ed. and Postgraduate Psychology at Loreto College jointly hosted a session titled [Beyond the Behaviour: Recognising Autism and ADHD in Students](#). The resource person was Mrs. Priyanka Bhoopal (Bhattacharya), who shared expert insights with first-year PG Psychology and final-year B.Ed. students. Mrs. Bhoopal provided a comprehensive overview of Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), emphasising the teacher’s role in early recognition and intervention. She also addressed common learning disabilities and clarified the distinction between typical misbehaviour and neurodevelopmental disorders, using real-life examples and a visual presentation.



The Departments of Education and Psychology, in collaboration with the India Autism Center, organised a [Workshop on Play Therapy and Neurodiversity](#) on April 7, 2025 to observe Autism Awareness Day. Facilitated by Ms. Puja Dutta and Ms. Medha Dey, the session introduced participants to the principles and practices of play therapy for supporting neurodivergent children. Interactive activities, group discussions, and case examples emphasised its therapeutic value, especially for children with autism. The workshop enhanced participants’ understanding of neurodiversity and inclusive education, equipping future educators and professionals with foundational tools to promote emotional well-being through child-centered practices.



DEPARTMENT EVENTS

On April 28, 2025, Loreto College hosted [Write It Right Series I](#), a Script Writing Workshop organised by the Departments of Film Studies, Bengali, and Journalism & Mass Communication, in collaboration with the IQAC. The session featured acclaimed filmmaker and scriptwriter Mr. Atanu Ghosh as the resource person. Through film clips and in-depth discussions, Mr. Ghosh explored narrative structure, character development, dialogue writing, and the revision process. His insights into short-format scripts and storytelling captivated participants. The workshop was an enriching experience for students and faculty from Loreto and other institutions, offering practical exposure to cinematic scriptwriting.



On May 5, 2025, the [Write It Right Series II](#) workshop was held at Loreto College, organised by the Departments of Film Studies, Bengali, and Journalism & Mass Communication in collaboration with the IQAC. The session focused on scriptwriting for OTT and television, covering both fiction and non-fiction formats. Resource persons included director Anindo Banerjee (joining from Dhaka), screenwriter Aditi Majumdar, and journalist Dibyendu Ghosh. Topics included market-driven narratives, TRP-oriented



scripting, and news writing for broadcast. The bilingual, interactive workshop enriched students with practical insights into professional scriptwriting for modern media platforms.

On May 11, 2025, the Departments of Film Studies and Journalism & Mass Communication, in collaboration with the Central Library of Loreto College and Cine Central, Calcutta, organised [Sandip Ray Unplugged](#), a special interactive session with acclaimed filmmaker Mr. Sandip Ray at his Bishop Lefroy Road residence. Four selected students engaged in a rich dialogue with Mr. Ray, discussing his cinematic journey, his experiences as a director, and insights into contemporary filmmaking. Faculty members including Mrs. Dipanwita Ghosh, Dr. Bonny Ghosh, and Dr. Soumya Dutta also contributed to the discussion. The session offered students a rare and valuable learning experience.

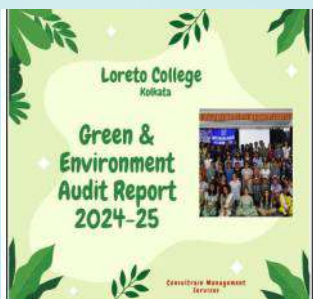
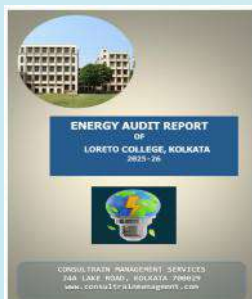

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS) UNIT

The NSS Unit celebrated [National Youth Day](#) by organising three consecutive events from January 11 to 13, 2025. An exciting event called “Happy Hearts” featured games and other engaging activities for thirty children from four shelter homes across the city. The event was conceptualised in line with Swami Vivekananda’s emphasis on service as well as physical activities for a healthier society. Blankets were distributed to the homeless and the needy following a blanket distribution drive conducted in college from January 3 to 10, 2025. In the last event, Swami Vishwadyananda ji from Swami Vivekananda’s Ancestral House and Cultural Centre spoke on the concept of ‘Shiva Gyane Jiva Seva’ or service in the form of worship.



On March 13, 2025, two volunteers from the NSS Unit—Meghna Ghosh and Rashmeet Kaur—participated in a [Training of Trainers](#) (TOT) Red Ribbon Club (RRC) Peer Educators at Swasthya Bhavan. Organised by the West Bengal State AIDS Prevention and Control Society (WBSAP&CS) and



conducted by Dr. Prasenjit Dey, this interactive session provided in-depth knowledge on HIV/AIDS awareness, ways to counter misinformation, and the role of peer educators in spreading awareness. The event was graced by the presence of the General Secretary of WBSAP&CS, who highlighted the importance of youth leadership in promoting a strong sense of social awareness.

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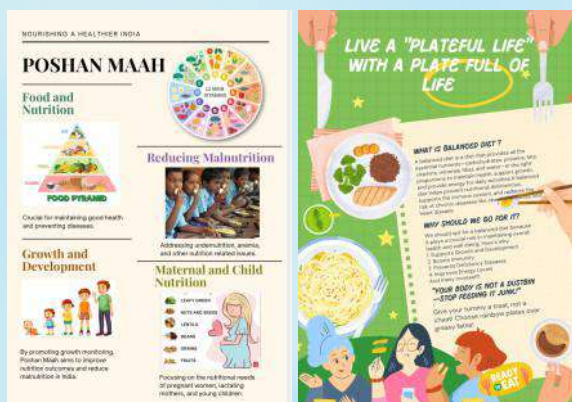

The women demonstrated keen interest in learning new skills to make toys, woollen bags, batik, and bandhani. Students from Loreto College also participated in the programme and assisted the women in learning new skills.



On April 20, 2025, the NSS Unit observed **Poshan Maah** by organising an online poster-making competition on the importance of following a balanced diet. This event aimed to combine health education with creativity, reinforcing the college's focus on well-rounded development of the students. Many entries were received from students of various departments, each showcasing creativity, originality, and artistic flair. 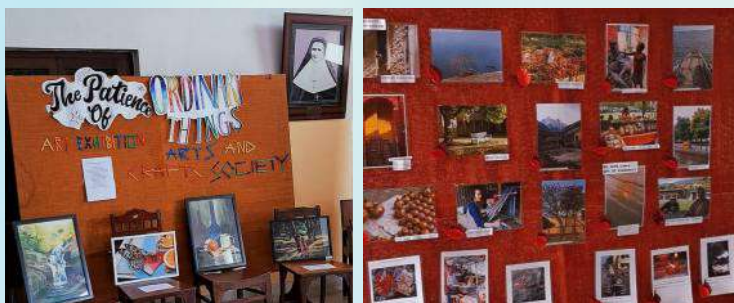


Paper Bag Making by the Women of Boinchtala Village

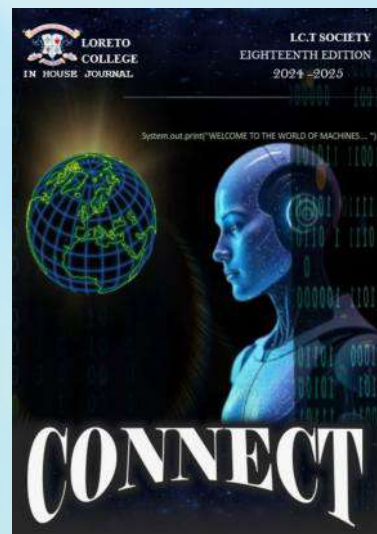
